Dear Saints of Grace,

As we begin December this year, we begin in the first week of Advent, as is often the case. I say it regularly in Advent, but if you recall Advent means coming. The season of Advent is the season where we look at our Lord's having come to us at the first Christmas. In some years, I've done Advent series that look at that coming in view of things like His coming as the light of the world in the darkness of our sin. I've looked at it in view of the hymn O Come, O Come Emmanuel, which speaks of His coming as that God with us. This year I'll be looking at that coming in view of the commonly held themes for the Sundays of the season: Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

To be clear, apart from the theme of Joy for the third Sunday, these are not themes that are steeped in a long tradition of the Church. They have some grounding in the readings for those Sundays: the first of hope because of the prophecies Jesus fulfilled; joy because of the call to rejoice in the Lord always on the third Sunday. However, if you look on the internet, you'll find some different listings for the themes. However, this list appears to be the most common. It also seems helpful for us to meditate on this year. In the midst of the challenges that we are experiencing, is it not a good reminder that our hope, peace, joy, and even our love are all grounded in our Lord Jesus? We so often stray from that knowledge, but as we prepare our hearts for His coming, those hearts so prone to wander require a call to return to their rightful focus.

In view of that, we'll hear about these themes for the Wednesday evening Advent services which will be at their usual time of 7:00pm on Wednesday evenings on December 2, 9, and 16<sup>th</sup>. The s2nd will be the theme of Hope, the 9th the theme of Peace, the 16th the theme of Joy, and the theme of Love will be for Christmas Day. Those will also be recorded and the link sent to you as usual.

In the meantime, we will be figuring out just how to go about having our Christmas Services. Based on the attendance we had for the Thanksgiving Service, it is clear that we'll have to offer multiple services. However, just what those services will look like and what times they will be offered is yet to come. Keep your eyes peeled for that information to be sent to you. Likewise, our Voter's Assembly will certainly have a different approach than in years past. There will likely be the ability to attend via Zoom, but again, the details for that will be forthcoming.

In any case, as we look at all of the oddities this year keeps bringing, thankfully, we rest in the One who is worthy of our Hope, who gives us His Peace, who brings us His Joy in the midst of all sadness, and whose Love has caused Him to be born for us at the first Christmas that He could lay down His life for us on the first Good Friday, that we may know that eternal life is our by His resurrection on the first Easter. Thanks be to God in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Pastor opened our meeting with prayer. Minutes of the last meeting held in February were read and approved.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Since the beginning of the Covid19 breakout, we have been recording the services and putting them out on the internet to our congregation.

Pastor has also been doing this for weekly devotions. Sunday services have been holding at about 15 to 20 persons at each service. Sunday Bible classes are being held between services with about 10 to 12 in attendance. Hopefully, we will be able to sustain this until the end of the pandemic. Keep praying and rely on God to help us through this.

<u>Financial Secretary</u>: No report

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: There have been enough receipts coming in through October to pay bills. Fortunately, there have been no huge bills. We are slightly under budget, but no funds were transferred from the Legacy account. We did receive a \$5000.00 gift from Vi Beck memorials which was split between the Building Fund and the Roof Fund. Thank you to all the boards for staying in and under their budgets. Thank you to an anonymous donor who paid for the parking lot resurfacing. Also thank you to the Fullers who have snow plowed the parking lot over the last couple years free of charge.

<u>Trustees' Report</u>: After the parking lot resurfacing, there seems to be one bad spot that is crumbling. This will be repaired in the spring. The parkway tree which was damaged when a car ran into it, has been replaced. Electrical work has been completed in the parking lot, the stained glass window, and lights throughout the building. Both the a/c and the boiler have been inspected with both found to be in good condition. The boiler room door has been replaced with one that doesn't slam! The evergreen bushes on the north and south side of the church have been removed because they were all dying. Should you have suggestions for new landscaping, let Linda McGuire know. The area under the tree at the corner has been cleaned up with maybe stone or chips to be put down. Jim and Linda McGuire power washed the bricks once the evergreens were removed. Thank you Jim and Linda!

Elders Report: We will continue to meet Sundays holding the two services at 8:00 am and 10:30 am. Thanksgiving service will be Wednesday evening at 7:00 pm and we are planning Wednesday Advent services as well as Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. Church Christmas trees will be going up Saturday 11/28 at 10:00 am. Thank you to Ron Kolar, Steve Latman and Gary Clausen for their service. They have chosen not to be on the ballot at this time.

<u>Walter High School</u>: Currently there are 230 students enrolled; 65% attend in person and 35% attend virtually. Twenty-five percent are taking college courses at Concordia for college credits. There is a brick paver fund drive in motion. So far, 75 pavers have been sold; each brick is a \$500 donation. Please consider donating to Walther for the future growth of these young men and women.

Grace Christian Academy: One teacher tested positive for covid, so now teaching is all virtual.

<u>Board of Christian Education</u>: We are continuing to meet in person every 4 to 5 weeks. Lessons and activities are being emailed to families for home teaching.

Confirmation class is meeting on Sunday and Pastor is still planning on a May confirmation.
