Dear Saints of Grace,

In any case, we often like to look at the new year as an opportunity for new beginnings. However, as we think of that, I think we can make a strong correlation to the faith.

But that resurrection of Jesus is ours. It is yours by the promise of God to you in baptism. That means that you may not see that new beginning, but it has been begun in you. You do have that break, you do have a clean start, a new life in Jesus. In light of that new life, we continue on in the joy of that life and its proclamation in this year to come. As we do so, we continue to pray that the end of the pandemic will be here and that with its end we may enjoy that fellowship that is proper to the Church face to face. In the meantime, I will continue with providing my devotions for the weekly readings. We'll also continue with uploading recordings of the service, that you may hear many times a week and in multiple ways of that love of our God for you, and the new life He gives you in His Gospel.

As I say that, and acknowledge our circumstances, I encourage you also to please keep in touch with us. It's always good to hear from you. Also, with regard to finances, I want to thank you that you have been faithful in ensuring the work of the Gospel can continue here at Grace. After opening our meeting with a prayer and approving the minutes from the November meeting, Rev. Jacob and Tia Corzine were unanimously welcomed as new voting members.
