Dear Saints of Grace,

Once more the season of Advent is upon us, and we are barreling forward toward Christmas. It seems that this is always such a hectic time of year for so many, but in the midst of it, I encourage you to take time from the hecticness and pause in consideration of what this season is really about. As I think I have pointed out before, it's good to recall that Advent is actually a penitential season like Lent. To be sure, there is an aspect to it that is less restrained than Lent, but even still, in the history of the Church it was a season that focused on spiritual disciplines and even fasting (a hard thing in our culture in December!). This, however, is why we have our additional Wednesday evening services. As the Church directs her focus on celebrating the coming of our Lord into this world to bear our sin and be our Savior, additional gathering to hear the Word and pray are always beneficial to our souls and lives in the Lord.

For those prayer offices this year, which we will be having on the 1st, 8th, and 15th at 7:00 P.M., we will be looking at the "hymns" of Advent/Christmas. What do I mean by that? Do I mean hymns like "Savior of the Nations Come," "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," or other more culturally favored songs? I don't. Those are certainly wonderful, and many are worthy of study, but what we will be looking at are the songs we see in the Gospels, specifically in the Gospel of Luke surrounding the birth of Jesus: the Benedictus, the Magnificat, and the Gloria.

Now if I listed those, and you said, "what?" I am sure you are not alone. So to explain, the Benedictus is the song that Zechariah, John the Baptist's father, sang at the birth of John, as John was the one promised to make straight paths for the Lord. The name comes from the first words of the song in Latin. Benedictus means "blessed." The song starts, "Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel."

The Magnificat is the song that Mary sang when the angel Gabriel came to her to tell her of the news that she would be the one to carry the Lord in her womb, giving birth to the Savior of the world. That one may be familiar to you as we sing it in all of our Wednesday evening services, both in Advent and Lent. Its name comes from the Latin word beginning of the song as well, "magnifies." As she says, "My soul magnifies the Lord…"

Finally, the Gloria. This is one that I know you are familiar with because we sing it almost every week on Sunday Morning. In Setting Three, the setting of the service we use the most and the one that is very similar to the old TLH (Red Hymnal) service, it begins, "Glory be to God on high." Gloria, once more is the Latin term for the beginning of that song too. The Gloria is the song the angels sang at the birth of Jesus as they appeared to the Shepherds in the field.

Studying and singing these songs is good for us because it connects us to the life of the Church going back to the Lord's birth. It reminds us of the immense joy that is ours as He has been so gracious to us as to enter into the muck of our sin in this world and redeem us to eternal joy and life in Him.

Grace Lutheran Church Voters Meeting November 21, 2021

After Pastor opened the meeting with prayer, the minutes of the September meeting were read and approved.

Pastor's Report: Thanks to everyone for being so understanding when Jessica Zickler came down with covid and thanks, also, to Pastor Corzine for taking care of the Sunday services for two weeks. Pastor is still processing his Phd applications due in January. For Advent services this year, the theme will be the Hymns of Advent. Services will be Wednesday evenings at 7:00 pm. The circuit forum met yesterday and Pastor was accepted as the circuit visitor. There is an open house at Redeemer, Elmhurst, this afternoon from 12:00 to 3:00 pm. All are welcome to join in the celebration of their new renovation of the sanctuary. Looking ahead to Christmas, Christmas Eve service will be at 5:00 pm, Christmas Day at 10:00 am and Sunday the 26th at 9:00 am.

<u>Financial Secretary:</u> There is no report at this time, but there will be the latest report in the newsletter. Bob Blessman has been set up for the direct deposit program but there are about 3 hours of tutorials to sort through.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: There have been no major expenses but there will be a bill coming up for the repair of the boiler. There is about \$46,000.00 in checking as of 10/31/21 and currently \$170,800.00 in the legacy funds.

<u>Elders</u>: Pastor will be on vacation 1/2/2022 and the church office will be closed the week during Christmas and New Years. A gift of \$500.00 was given to St. Pauls Lutheran Church in Beecher, Illinois, after succumbing to a fire. Church Christmas trees will be decorated Saturday 11/27. Lastly, the tech team would like to work on the wiring in Pastor's office over Christmas week.

<u>Trustees</u>: This past week, two pumps were replaced on the boiler for about \$2,500.00. Since the boiler is 70 years old, trustees felt it wise to get estimates for a new boiler. Also, they are looking for a new lawn service – suggestions welcome.

<u>Planning Committee</u>: The meeting was devoted to discussion regarding capital expenses for the future upkeep of the church building and grounds and parsonage. They are looking for sources to review the building as to what needs immediate attention and what can wait – such as the boiler and parking lot. Also, ideas for church outreach in the community were brought up such as the Tower Tree display in town.

Board of Education: At the last teachers meeting, it was decided the children would participate in the Christmas Eve service by singing and leading the congregation in hymns.

The children will be practicing on Sunday mornings with the service being at 5:00 pm Christmas Eve.

Walther Christian High School: In the month of 9/23 & 9/27, 99 students participated in the Christian Day of Service by helping at the NPO "Feed My Starving Children." The entire school celebrated Hispanic Heritage month in October by visiting the National Museum of Mexican Art. Mrs. Lori Boyer, an outstanding choral director, has returned to Walther to teach music and didn't hesitate to get the students singing ("Oh When the Saints Come Marching In") while they were outside for an unexpected fire drill. Coming up on February 19, 2022, will be the Bronco Benefit Banquet at Maggiano's Little Italy in Schaumberg. On February 26, 2022, the second Bronco Benefit will be held via Zoom all across America. Finally, the Wing Stop foundation donated \$5,000.00 to enhance the STEM program.

<u>Grace Christian Academy</u>: Grace now has increased to 105 students. They have applied for a grant from the Albert Pick Jr. Fund and are now in the process of their Thanksgiving and Christmas funding appeals. The Thanksgiving Appeal will be sent out to 5000 potential donors. A statement was then read regarding social emotional learning and what are the core values of Grace Academy. (A separate print out has been submitted for the newsletter-see following page.)

Old Business: None

<u>New Business:</u> The budget for 2022 was presented with very few changes. The increase is approximately 4.3%. Please review it for voting in December. The slate for officers was then presented so please review it also for voting at the December meeting.

With no further business at hand, a motion was made and passed to adjourn the meeting. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Social Emotional Learning is being emphasized. It was noted by some Board Members that this serves as a helpful focus in place of Critical Race Theory. What is the greatest ingredient that foreshadows success after graduation? A – ambition, B – IQ, C – ability to manage emotions, D – academic achievement. Ans.: C is composed of EI/EQ. EI is emotional intelligence; EQ is the ability to monitor one's own and other feelings and emotions, to discriminate among them and to use this information to guide one's thinking and – actions. "If your emotional abilities aren't in hand, if you don't have self awareness, if you are not able to manage your distressing emotions, if you can't have empathy and effective relationships, then no matter how smart you are, you are not going to get very far" – Daniel Goleman.

EQ counts for twice as much as IQ and technical skills in determining who will be successful. "When it comes to success in business, EQ eats IQ for breakfast"

EI is being smart with feelings and emotions: self awareness, self regulation, motivation, empathy, and social skills. EI is the greatest single predictor of success.

What constitutes Success?

- 1. Strong communicator communicates and collaborates with others.
- 2. Understanding people able to empathize and relate to others.
- 3. Conveys respect treats people honorably with kindness.
- 4. Connected to God demonstrates a commitment to God through words and actions.
- 5. Exhibits perseverance shows grit and determination through adversity.
- 6. Strives for excellence takes pride in the work and puts forth the best effort.
- 7. Shows responsibility radically dependable and able to complete tasks successfully.

Success Skills Report Card

Of the 7 skills in determining success each student will be judged with results discussed with the respective parents.
