Dear Saints of Grace,

This past weekend we observed the holiday of Memorial Day when we reflect and give thanks for those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice of their lives that we would have freedom in our country. What a blessing that freedom is, most importantly, the freedom to gather in worshipping our God without fear. As we reflect on that, we give thanks to those who served in all of the wars of our time: Afghanistan; Iraq; Vietnam; Korea; World War II; and World War I; as well as all of the lesser known conflicts. If you're like me, however, the war you most often reflect upon with regard to our freedoms is World War II. At that time, there was such an obvious tie to the threat that Hitler and the Nazis posed to our freedom and the relief of that threat in the victory over them in the war. As we read our book this summer, *Mere Christianity*, you may not know it, but it has a tie to that war as well. The author of the book, Clive Staples Lewis—often called C.S., or to those who knew him "Jack"—originally presented the chapters of the book as radio "talks" during World War II in Britain. It seems that the BBC thought this would be an ideal topic to help reassure and calm the British people as they endured bomb after bomb destroying their cities at the hands of the German air force. While the topic certainly seems understandably pertinent for us as Christians, if you don't know Lewis, you might wonder why he was chosen as the presenter.

Jack's story is an interesting one. His mother died when he was only nine years old. This trauma led him to decide to become an atheist by the age of fourteen. This decision was confirmed all the more in his mind during his service of Great Britain in World War I. However, after the war as Lewis taught at Oxford University his mind began to change. In 1929, he saw the evidence for the existence of God to be more compelling than not. In the fall of 1931 following a conversation with dear friends and fellow Oxford professors J.R.R. Tolkien (author of the Lord of the Rings books) and Hugo Dyson, Lewis was finally convinced of Christianity.


It was this internal wrestling with the faith that made Jack an apologist for it. He knew why people didn't believe, and he knew how he had come to believe. This gave him a unique perspective in defending Christianity and also explaining it. In fact, if you have ever read his *Chronicles of Narnia*, especially *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe*, or have seen the movies, you can see how even his imagination was drawn into the depths of the beauty of our confession. It seems this was what drew the people at the BBC to elect Jack as the ambassador of the Church to Britain via these talks. And through them, we have now the book for this summer.

If you are unfamiliar with *Mere Christianity*, it is considered one of the finest writings of the Church, not only in the Twentieth century, but in its history. In fact, in an online "tournament" a number of years ago, it was considered the second best Christian Book of all time, losing out only to St. Augustine's "Confessions." In any case, we invite you to join us on June 29, August 3, and August 31 as we join together in reading it, and learning from a master teacher about the work of our Lord Jesus Christ.
