Dear Saints of Grace,

As I was browsing the internet recently, there was a link that came up on a feed that was entitled "The Decay of our Society: 10 Things That Were Once Great That Have Been Lost Forever." This list had some things that were related to sort of quaint memories like movies being better in the past, going outside for play as a child more, and the like. Then there were some that were a bit more serious such as how we have so many machines and interact with people less. Finally, there were a couple related to things like virtue, that there used to be virtue for the sake of virtue. I honestly was surprised that this was noted but was glad.

As much as I could relate to these things, however, it's interesting how May has something to say about them. That is, as I was reflecting on writing this, I realized that as we look forward to the upcoming occasions in the Church Year this month, the Sundays ahead are quite pertinent. In particular, what I mean is that this is the month where we have the Ascension and Pentecost. In the Ascension, we are reminded that our Lord ascended to the Right Hand of the Father, and at Pentecost that He sent His Holy Spirit.

How is this pertinent to "our decaying society?" As we might mourn the changes we see around us, on the one hand, coming out of Good Friday and Easter, we can remember that mankind is deeply sinful and has been since the Fall into sin. We can also remember that Christ has won the victory over that sin and death in His resurrection at Easter. On the other hand, the Ascension reminds us is that He reigns even now. While things around us change, this Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. And in that steadfastness, we even now have the comfort that He rules over all things. He reigns to work all things to our good. That's what He does at the Right Hand of the Father. He also intercedes for us there. As things change, He is there to help us and guard us in the faith, guarding and keeping us with Him until we enjoy His presence face to face. To do this He sends His Spirit to His Church that He would sanctify us for that ultimate end. The Spirit works this good of bringing people to faith and caring for them in the proclamation of the Word of Christ and bringing Christ Himself to us in His Holy Supper.

With that in mind, then, as we see things changing around us we have great comfort. We have the comfort we are reminded of this month in our lessons: Christ has been raised and now is ascended to work all things for our good. Likewise, He has not left us as "orphans" (John 14:18), but sent His Spirit to care for us in all times and places!
