Dear Saints of Grace,

You probably have seen that in a week we'll be experiencing a significant astronomical event: a total solar eclipse visible in our region. In Chicago the coverage of the moon visible in front of the sun won't be total, but will still be somewhere around 94%. This means that in Chicagoland observers will see 94% of the sun covered by the moon. With this being so close to Good Friday and Easter, though, I couldn't help but think about the darkness experienced from noon to three when Jesus was on the cross. It's often asked whether that darkness could be explained by an eclipse. I'll admit in writing this that I had to look it up. Then I felt a bit embarrassed because I should have known. It couldn't have been caused by an eclipse. Why not? Because the timing of the crucifixion fell within the festival of Passover. The timing of the Passover feast was related to a full moon. You see the Hebrew Calendar would begin its months at the New Moon (when the moon isn't visible, the opposite phase of the Full Moon). But Passover is always celebrated at the Full Moon of the first Hebrew month of Nisan. This is why our Easter celebration shifts in its timing from year to year. It's always the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Vernal Equinox (the day in the Spring when there is equal sunlight and darkness). So, because of the timing with the Full Moon in conjunction with Passover, you couldn't have an eclipse. Eclipses can only be caused by New Moons.

So, then what do we do with the darkness on the cross? We understand that this is a miracle by which our Heavenly Father testified to the darkness of Christ's death on the cross, that is to the darkness of death itself and the importance of Christ the God-Man suffering death in our place. To describe this, the gospels tell us that darkness was spread across "the land." Now, this word for land here could be just the local region, or it could be over the whole earth. Some early Christian writers claimed to have found evidence in historians at that time that were outside of the region of the Middle East who spoke of some kind of darkness. They said this was that darkness when Christ was on the cross. If this is actually the case, we're not certain. But that doesn't matter. We trust the testimony of the witnesses of Christ's crucifixion we have in Scripture. All the more, we trust in the joy of Easter which shows the victory of Christ's death over death, and the light of His life which overcomes the darkness of sin, death, and the devil.

So then, as we experience the darkness we'll be having April 8th, especially with this falling so close to Easter, let that remind you also of Christ's victory over darkness. As the moon recedes from the sun and light returns be reminded of how darkness has overcome the world in sin, but Christ has overcome sin, the world, death, and the devil himself! Rejoice in how that victory and light is promised to you in the waters of baptism and is fed to you in His Holy Supper. Thanks be to God!!


