Dear Saints of Grace.

As we turn from the Christmas season, we return in our letter to the things in the church. Actually, Christmas does keep going through the 5<sup>th</sup> and finishes with Epiphany on the 6<sup>th</sup>, so don't turn from it just yet! And in view of that, in this article and later in the newsletter, we're going to look at something in the sanctuary that is unique to the Advent and Christmas season. That is what are called the "Chrismons" on the Christmas trees. These Chrismons are the ornaments that you see on the tree which are in various symbolic shapes. In fact the word "Chrismon" is a combination of "Christ" and "monogram."

To be sure, we have far too many Chrismons for me to dedicate time in this letter to describing all of them. If you would like more information on them, please note that we have a description of them assembled by Nancy Kolar in her days here which is on the table in the Narthex (the room between the sanctuary and the doors which open to Wolf Road). However, I would like to take time to talk about a couple of them.

First of all, many of the Chrismons are forms of cross shapes. I would assume that, while the specific meanings of the various crosses might by unknown, the fact that they are cross shapes would be obvious in the connection to the Christ child born in the manger who grew to carry our sins to the cross. There are also a number which relate to imagery like stars, which hopefully can be seen to connect to Christ as the Light of the World and the star at His birth which led the magi to worship Him. Others are things like anchors, which relate to Christ as the anchor of our life and faith in the unsure seas of this world. Those are pretty straightforward (although not all of them are necessarily obvious, I'll admit). So I'd like to focus the rest of this letter on some of those that come from Greek letters.

The most common image among the Chrismons relating to Greek letters is the "chi rho." That image looks like this  $\mathbf{R}$  (an "X" with a "P" going through it). The meaning of that is "Christ." You see in Greek, Christ is  $\mathbf{XPI}\Sigma\mathbf{TO}\Sigma$ (Christos), but hopefully you can see the XP which begin the word. This means anything that has that "chi rho" is connected to that. You'll also see a lot with XC. That is because the C is the form of  $\Sigma$  often used at the end of the word. So XC also means Christ. Another set of letters you'll often see in Chrismons are I, IHS, IHC, IC, and IS. All of those come from the Greek spelling of Jesus:  $IH\Sigma OY\Sigma$  (Iesous). That means they all reference Jesus. Sometimes, combining these two a bit, you'll see this: X. That means "Jesus Christ." It is just the I over the X. Next, you'll also often see A and  $\Omega$  or  $\alpha$  and  $\omega$ . These are the letters "alpha" and "omega." You might remember that because Jesus calls Himself the Alpha and the Omega in Revelation. He is the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. Lastly, you'll see "NIKA." That means "Victor," as in Christ is the victor, has won victory, over our enemies of sin, death, and the devil.

Of course, that's what we're celebrating at Christmas with these Chrismons, isn't it? We're celebrating that Christ has entered this world at the first Christmas so that He could live the perfect life in our place and carry our sins to the cross on Good Friday. All of that, so that He could rise from the dead on the first Easter that we would have victory with Him. Thanks be to God!


From the Women's Club

that the decorations on our chancel trees are not just "ornaments" but chrismons. The chrismons are symbols of Christianity from its earliest days. Our chrismons are white and gold – white meaning joy and purity and gold for the glory and majesty of Jesus christ.

Some of the letters are in Greek, some are written in a cipher or coded message such as Chi Rho, alpha and omega, INRI. Even daisies and lilies of the valley decorate some chrismons. Everything has a meaning. There are chrismons symbolizing Christ as the chief cornerstone, varieties of crosses and symbols meaning heaven, grace and earth. Butterflies, fish, sand dollars, lambs and doves represent the animal kingdom. There are also signs of the Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

All these chrismons were lovelingly made by several ladies of Grace some years ago and they still decorate our trees today. If you haven't picked up a chrismon folder in the narthex, please do so. Or visit the anniversary memory table for one and look at some chrismons close up. May these chrismons help remind you of the true meaning of Christmas.


