Dear Saints of Grace,

As we are coming into April, that means that we are not too far from Holy Week. As usual, we will be having our Maundy Thursday and Good Friday Services at 7:00 P.M. as well as our Easter Sunday Divine Service at 10:00 A.M. with the breakfast beforehand at 8:30. Also, if you look on the calendar, you might notice that on that Saturday, there is listed an Easter Vigil Service at 7:00 P.M. Please note that this is hosted by Redeemer in Elmhurst. As we have been hosting them for a joint Thanksgiving Eve service the past few years, the Easter Vigil serves as a counterpart to that. I have been assisting with that service for a number of years, but wanted to make a more intentional effort to notify you all of it. In light of that, I'll make more announcements encouraging you all to come, but do please feel free to join us for that at Redeemer in Elmhurst, at 123 St. Charles Rd.

Having said that, with Lent and Holy Week in mind, I thought that I would continue with the theme of items in the sanctuary this month by talking about the cross. Have you ever noticed how many crosses there are in the sanctuary? I'm sure you have noticed the big cross that lights up in the front, that one is sort of hard to miss. Likewise, I would expect you've noticed the crucifix on the baptismal font—a reminder that as we are baptized we are joined to Jesus' death for us that we might rise to new life being joined also to His resurrection. Additionally, you'll likely have noticed the crosses on the lectern (where the readings are read) and pulpit (where the sermon is preached).

However, there are quite a few more crosses in the sanctuary. For example, have you noticed the crosses in the stained glass windows? There are some there. Or, perhaps most subtly there are three crosses on each of the beams supporting the ceiling of the building. Have you noticed those? There are two that are engraved—one on each side of each beam—and there is one made from the wood of the beams themselves. Interestingly there are six beams. This means that there are twelve of the engraved crosses—an important number because twelve signifies the Church, the Twelve Tribes in the Old Testament, and the Twelve Disciples in the New Testament. I also wonder if the six crosses made from the wood of the beams themselves is also intentional. Specifically, I wonder if it is a reference to Jesus being crucified on the Sixth Day of the week, on Friday. Likewise, humans were created on the first Sixth Day making it logical that Jesus would die on the Sixth Day (and as I have noted before, rest on the Seventh Day and rise on the Eighth Day indicating the New Creation). How many crosses do you see in the sanctuary? Did I miss some?

In any case, with Holy Week coming, it is good for us to meditate on the cross of Jesus as we think about this. Thanks be to God it is by that cross, the instrument of death and execution, that Christ has died for our sins, so that in His resurrection we would have life, salvation, and the forgiveness of sins!


