Dear Saints of Grace,

As we have just taken time for another opportunity to celebrate our 100 years at Grace with our picnic on the 24th, I thank God for the many blessings we have in our fellowship together here! And thank God for perfect weather on the 24th as well! With the picnic, however, we also—as we do each year—look to getting back into the swing of things with the fall.

To start, as always, Sunday School for the kids will begin September 7th after the Divine Service. For the adults, we'll have our usual Voter's Meeting that day, so please join us as we talk about things pertinent for the business of the congregation. For the 14th, we had intended to have a presentation from the LCMS Foundation discussing estate planning and how to include Grace in that process in the most effective ways. However, the Northern Illinois District representative serving the Foundation is no longer in that role. I have reached out to another district's representative and will let you know what is to come, so please keep your eyes and ears open regarding that important conversation.

In view of discussing the joyful topic of estate planning, I thought I would piggyback and also talk about funeral planning in the following Adult Bible Classes. Of course, that is not something that we as a whole might be excited or comfortable talking about, but I think it is important for us to address the topic. All the more, we should remember that we can approach death in view of the hope—not just hope as an abstract wish, but a grounded certainty - that we have in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Funerals are an important testimony of the life of the Christian in Christ in addition to being a great component of pastoral care for the loved ones who grieve.

A few years ago, CPH published a book on funerals that will serve as the basis for my discussion, and additionally, we'll look at things like planning the service itself (hymns, and readings, etc. – something I encourage so that your loved ones don't have to worry about it), and have our friend Howard Eggert from Hallowell and James come for a presentation that you would be able to ask any questions you might have about the funeral process itself.

After that, I thought I would shift and take some time to do something sort of basic with the Sunday Morning Adult class and that is to look at Old Testament Stories. I think a lot of stories in the Old Testament are ones that we have either not read since Sunday School or read only in our story Bibles for our children. What a great thing to do, then, and revisit these essential stories of Scripture and see how Jesus shows Himself in them, even before the incarnation at His birth?

Obviously, there is a lot here, so please listen for what will be happening when. And again, thanks be to God for all of the blessings He has given to us, His flock here at Grace!

Did you know....

Grace's first Sunday school was held in September of 1925. Louis and Anna Winkelman, having five children of their own, wanted the youngsters of the neighborhood to benefit from weekly bible lessons. They invited them into their home each Sunday. Louis and Anna were the teachers.

Another strategy of Louis and Anna was to help kids "keep off the streets" and keep their minds and hands busy during the summer months by starting a Vacation Bible School. And that they did in the summer of 1927.

Pastor Herman Seitz had a great desire to have a Lutheran School in the area. And so doors opened at our little church in 1933 to 28 children first grade through fifth grade. Older grades were added as time went on. The classroom was the church proper itself with the pews moved to the side walls and classroom desks lined up for the children. The school continued until 1946.

On September 11, 1967, our Grace Nursery/Pre School opened with 20 three and four year olds. It was held from 9:00 to 11:30am Monday through Friday with Mrs. M. Peterson as the teacher.

School means learning and can take on many forms. Today we continue with Sunday school, adult bible class and confirmation instruction. School is for people of all ages. You can never stop learning and what better place than Grace Church. Check the memory table for more of God's Grace Upon Grace.


