Dear Saints of Grace,

This month, I'll be starting with pointing out the invitation for the Anniversary Banquet Dinner. Please make sure to RSVP for that by the November 2nd deadline (you'll also be seeing a reminder in the November newsletter, but don't let that dissuade you from responding early!).

As for other things, I'll continue my discussion of the elements of things in the church. I think I have touched on the major components of the sanctuary in terms of its furniture and the like. So, I will continue with some other elements. This month, I'll start with elements of the service itself. The first thing to know about the service is that it has two main components: the Liturgy or Service of the Word and the Liturgy or Service of the Sacrament. These two components reflect the promise of Christ to come into our presence through the means of the Word and the Sacrament. That is to say that Jesus meets us in a unique way in the Divine Service. If you've been to the Narrative Service, you've heard me talk about this, as I usually ask where Jesus is. Where is Jesus? Everywhere? Yes. In heaven? Yes. In our hearts by faith? Yes. But where does He promise to meet us for our benefit, that is to bless us? He does this in His Word, in the Word in Scripture, and in the Word as it is preached. I noted that when I talked about the pulpit and lectern a few months ago. He also promises to meet us as that Word is connected to the bread and wine of his Holy Supper. We can see these promises as He says about preaching "He who hears you hears me" (Luke 10:16), and in the Supper as He says "This is my body" (Matthew 26:26).

What the Liturgy does is point us to these promises. There is a flow and a buildup within each part such that it culminates with the promise. Christ promises to meet us in the Word, the Gospel proclaiming that Word with Jesus' own preaching, the pulpit housing that Word with the preaching of the called pastor. Jesus there, bringing His forgiveness, and with that forgiveness, His merciful presence. The same is true with the Supper. In the bread and wine, give us His own body and blood for our forgiveness. There He meets us, present with us in His grace. The Liturgy flows and builds up to these high points.

But it must also be said that all of this gives us a foretaste of heaven. We often think of heaven as being with those we love and getting to enjoy good things without having to experience the hard things that we do now. But the greatest gift is to be in the presence of our God face to face. In the Liturgy, this happens, but only in a way that can be seen with the eyes of faith. This makes the Divine Service heaven on earth. What an awesome thought! Here God is with us! God grant us those eyes of faith to see this glorious promise week in and week out!

Grace Lutheran Church Voters Assembly September 7, 2025

After opening our meeting wth prayer, we unanimously welcomed new members, David and Val Villegas and Bev Kopplin, as voting members.

The minutes of last June's meeting were approved as read.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Thanks to the Anniversary Committee for all their hard work this past year in planning events. The annual picnic was well attended possibly due to it being on Sunday after church. Since some of the items we want to put into the capsule are in November, we have decided to wait to present the capsule at the banquet. Our big finale is the banquet on November 16 with Dr. Rast as speaker. The divine service will be at 3:00 pm followed with a dinner in the church at 5:00 pm. An evite will be going out this week on the website and invites to members will be in the bulletins and newsletter.

Sunday school began today and confirmation will start today also. Adult bible class will start this Wednesday, Sept. 10 at 9:00 am and we will take up where we left off in the book of Esther. Sunday bible class will begin next Sunday and was supposed to have a representative from the LCMS Foundation to discuss estate planning for you and your family and also how that can still benefit the church. Unfortunately, the representative is no longer with the Foundation and we are looking for someone else. Instead, Pastor would like to have a discussion regarding funeral planning. Even though it may be hard to talk about, funerals give us closure and help us recognize our faith in Christ. He has a speaker in mind but the discussion would probably have to be some evening.

Lastly, we need to elect our delegates for the Circuit Forum and the District Convention. The convention will be held in Phoenix, Arizona, in July 2026.

<u>Financial Secretary's Report:</u> Receipts for August totaled \$11,270.00. We received \$130.00 from the sale of food at the picnic. We are under budget by \$11,155.00.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Giving is starting to improve. Items yet to be paid are the picnic, the humidifier and the new office computer. Balance on hand as of August 31, 2025, is \$117,570.18. Looking over the past eight months, receipts have totaled \$179,400.00 and expenses totaled \$166,141.00 leaving us under budget.

Elders Report: They will be meeting soon to discuss the fall activities.

<u>Trustees Report:</u> The humidifier has been purchased for \$1693.00 and will be installed this Tuesday. We really need this for all the wood in the building and the organ. Thanks to those who helped pull weeds and trim bushes this past season. It really helped beautify the building. Yuritzy has been contracted to do the fall clean up. Glenn has cleaned and refinished all the exterior doors – thank you. Ryan has a plan to straighted the mail box and thanks to Bob Dame for the new storage cabinet and mounting the speakers.

Board of Christian Education: Children are in session today.

Evangelism: No report

<u>Planning Committee:</u> We are looking for a new district contact for our LCMS Foundation discussion. We feel it is a good way to continue a solid future for Grace starting it's 101st year. We are waiting on permits from the village in order to continue progress on the parsonage egress. And the directory deadline is Sept. 12 in order to have it printed in time for the banquet. There are still several families who still need their photos taken. Good work, Zeke, and thank you.

<u>Old Business:</u> The committee looking into new windows coverings has interviewed about 5 vendors. They discussed roller shades, blinds and draperies. Overall the lowest cost would be the shades at about \$3000, verticle blinds would be about \$7800 and draperies could go from \$12,000 to \$14,000. After much discussion, shades and blinds have big drawbacks. Draperies seem to be the most durable and longlasting. The committee would recommend the draperies but the voters need to decide on funding.

Chris Krohe attended the August lay summit at Walther. He reported there were about 400 to 500 people in attendance. There were sessions on interchurch ideas, building projects for your church and how to interact with the community. It was well worth the time.

<u>New Business:</u> Next followed discussion on selection of delegates for the Circuit Forum. As for the pastoral delegate, the following motion was made:

MOTION: that Pastor Zickler be nominated as our church's pastoral delegate. PASSED

As for the lay delegate and the alternate, Chris Krohe and Bob Dame agreed to become delegates. Per vote by ballot: Bob Dame was elected lay delegate and Chris Krohe was elected alternate lay delegate. At this time, Pastor did not know the date for the forum.

With no further business at hand, the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's prayer.
